Guidelines for Authors

- 1. **Success stories.** Summary of what worked and how the community accomplished it.
- 2. Length. 1,000 words
- 3. Key Elements.
 - Background: what do we know?
 - Trigger: why did this happen?
 - Approach: what is it that you/others did?
 - Outcome: how did it turn out?
 - Voice: response/feedback by a stakeholder (e.g., mayor)
 - So what? recommendations to other communities of place and practice (e.g. people working on other hazards)
- 4. **Figures.** Include photos, maps, and or other graphics to illustrate local conditions.
- 5. Format. Digital (Word document)
- 6. **References.** Keep to a minimum. Use numbered footnotes.
- 7. **Title and Abstract Submission:** Use this <u>FORM</u> to submit your idea.
- 8. **Response from editors:** Within 4 weeks after submission
- Draft Submission: Within 4 weeks after editor email, send draft to Melanie Gall (<u>melanie.gall@asu.edu</u>), subject line: NAAHDRI Resilience Stories
- Final Submission: Within 4 weeks after reviewer responses send to Melanie Gall (<u>melanie.gall@asu.edu</u>), Subject line: NAAHDRI Mitigation Stories
